# Brainerd Riverfront Committee Meeting Notes March 24, 2016

CALL TO ORDER: Chair Rod Osterloh called the meeting to order at 3:08 p.m.

Erik Roberts made a motion to brand the project, "Brainerd Riverfront." Richard Polipnick seconded the motion. All committee members voted in favor and none were opposed. The motion carried.

The group agreed to keep it simple: Brainerd Riverfront Committee

#### 3. REPORT ON SERVICE CLUB PRESENTATIONS:

Jennifer Bergman reported that she and Heidi have given four presentations so far to Kiwanis, Morning and Afternoon Rotary, and Sertoma. They would also like to present to the Baxter Lions. ## 7. MISSISSIPPI RIVER TRAIL, MARK OSTGARDEN:

Mark Ostgarden discussed the Mississippi River Trail and how Brainerd is a host city. Because of this, the City of Brainerd received a new kiosk this past winter that can be displayed some place in the city. Ostgarden asked the committee for input on deciding where it should go. He also noted it can be a temporary place as they may want to move it as the project moves forward.

Places to consider: Kiwanis Park or across the Brainerd HS parking lot along the river and current trail. The committee discussed the possibilities and agreed that Kiwanis Park is the place to put it.

#### 8. REVIEW CONSOLIDATED PROJECTS LIST/TIMING:

The committee went over a timeline that SEH presented. The group also discussed the cultural/performing arts center project idea and if that's something SEH should focus on. They determined no, not now as there isn't funding for it. SEH should focus their energy on the riverfront development.
